Belief determines behavior

- Catullus (d. 54 BC)
- Judgment motivates repentance (Acts 17)

Belief determines behavior

- 2 Peter 2:1-3 sad predictions:
- 1: false teachers will come. 1 K.18 ... 22.
- 2: many will follow their error and immorality.
- 3: greedy liars will mislead blind for profit.
 - Deceptive (fabricated) words
 - Destruction is not dozing / slumbering
 - Donations (covetousness) not always free

Belief determines behavior

Sad ending: 2 Peter 2: teachers or converts?

- 19-20: fate of false teachers concludes chapter.
- 21: includes fate of converts (2, 18).
- 22: both groups suffer same tragic end. Mt.15:14

I. The World Defiles, 20a

World

- World' is not earth . . .
- World' is not people in general
- World: all that is hostile to God, 20
 - Lost in sin; wholly at odds with anything divine, ruined and depraved - BDAG

World

- Escaped pollutions stain, defilement, filthy things [synonym: v.10].
 - Ja.1:27, keep oneself unstained by the world.

Synonym: the times

- Thoughts, opinions, actions, phases of society: religious world, scientific world....
- 2 Co.4:4, whose minds the *god of this age* has <u>blinded</u>, who <u>do not believe</u>, lest the <u>light</u> <u>of the gospel</u> of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them
- Ga.1:4, who gave Himself for our sins, that
 He might deliver us from this present evil age

In spite of revelation and conscience, faithful were few, evil was predominant

Jesus is Lord and Savior

- 2 Pt.2:9 His part
- Through knowledge our part

2 Peter 1:2 ... 2 Peter 3:18

- Know (in some form): 16 x in 2 Peter
- 2nd Century gnostic heresies discussed 'true' knowledge
- One who rejects light will live in darkness

Cause: entanglements

- Fish in net . . . sheep . . . gladiators . . .
- Overcome, defeated, conquered, controlled by . . . (19-20) –
 - Slaves: bondage; evil desires master them, 19
 - Pollutions: 19-20; 1:4, depravity

We become either regenerate or degenerate

Cause Condition: worse off (20-21)

- Harder to restore apostates.
- May become angry, hardened, disillusioned. Mt.12:43-45. Hb.6:4-6.
- Worse influence on others. Mk.4:7.
- Worse punishment? (Lk.12:47-48). Ac.5
- Reflects on Lord. 2:21

Cause Condition Comparison:

- Dog returns to own vomit.
 - Escaped corruption within, returned to it.
 - Pr.26:11, As a dog returns to his own vomit, So a fool repeats his folly.
- Sow returns to mire.

- Growth, 2 Pt.1:5-11; 3:18
- Warnings, 2 Pt.2:1-3
- Insight, 2 Pt.3:8-9

Conclusion

- The false teachers were not made outside the NT.
 - They obeyed truth, rejected it, then seduced others to join them in eternal misery
