- Five times in NT
- Synecdoche
 - Set of wheels
 - -Hired hands

Implies...

- a. Weakness
 - b. Ignorance
- c. Dependence on God

Deity cannot die, 9...14

- Jesus became man, Ph.2:5-11
- Hb.2:14, flesh and blood
 - Satan got his way (Gn.3)
 - It destroyed satan / saved us
- Hb.2:15, if satan murders us, it fulfills our greatest hope [no fear – atonement]
 - Ancients viewed death with horror
 - Tartarus ... Sisyphus ... Tantalus ...
 - Joab

Deity cannot die, 8...14

 Hb.2:16-18, High Priest – blood sacrifice for sins (9:24-28)

'Had not the Death of death to Death by death his death-blow given, For ever closèd were the gate, the gate of life and heaven'

'A paradox. Jesus suffered and overcame death; the devil, wielding death in his hand, succumbed' – Bengel

Paul shows that God <u>can</u> give us changed bodies (1 Co.15)

- Flesh and blood cannot inherit kingdom of God = our present earthly bodies (subject to decay) are not capable of enjoying heaven
- Lk.24:37-39, Jesus was no immaterial spirit
 - bodily resurrection
- Lk.24:49, flesh / bones...

1 Co.15

- 50: flesh and blood alive when He comes = present weakness. Corruption = the dead.
- 51: 'mystery': no details about the change (transformation)
- 52: moment: 'atom'
- 52: twinkling of eye
- 52: last trumpet (14:8) often awoke armies...
- 52: changed into glorified body
- 53: incorruption (not subject to decay) . . . immortal [deathlessness)

1 Co.15

54-55: death swallowed many...

- Now death is swallowed up in victory (death is killed...as defeated enemy)
 - Scorpion without sting
- Sin is death's only weapon
- Destroy sin death is harmless... Ph.1:21

1 Co.15

56-57: victory over sin and death

Without law, no sin

Death, the last Enemy is no longer a threat.

Passage taunts Death: 'Where is your victory, so universal, so feared?'

57: Jn.11:11-15
