2 Co.8:9

- V.1: based on God's grace
- V.2: tested in furnace of trial and trouble
- V.3: beyond call of duty
- V.4: poor begged for privilege of giving
- V.5: their first gift: themselves
- V.7: 'and in your love'
 - The Corinthians had repented; their love was restored
 - As they had abounded in other things, they should abound in grace... (the gift itself)

Chrysostom, v.7

"And he [Paul] said not, that you give, but that you <u>abound</u>; in faith...in utterance, and knowledge, and in all earnestness, to the attaining of all other virtue, and in your love, that you may <u>abound</u> in this grace also"

This is a test of Corinthians' sincerity / love, 8
