- Moses Ex.18:18
- Giving Ex.36:7
- Levites Nu.16:7
- ... 2 Kings 13:6 Nevertheless they did not depart from the sins of the house of Jeroboam, who had made Israel sin, but walked in them; and the wooden image also remained in Samaria.

Jeroboam: man of great potential; God's choice to rule Israel

- 1 Kg.11:26-40 servant of Solomon...
- 1 Kg.11:38 if ... then...
 - 1 Kg.12, Rehoboam
 - 1 Kg.12:2-3, 16-20...25... Jeroboam

Strong leader; did not trust God, 26-27

Worldly counsel, 28: "too much for you"

- We can't grow in strength without overcoming difficulties
 - Physically
 - Mentally
 - Spiritually. Mt.16²⁴ Then Jesus said to His disciples, If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross, and follow Me.

- "But I want to do just enough to get by"
- Contrast
 - -Gn.43:11, best
 - Mt.6:33, first
 - Mk.12:30, *all*
 - -Rv.2:4, against you . . . first love . . .
 - Christians . . . churches

- "How can I know if I'm doing my best?"
 - Two families: both sick on Sunday...
 - Two families: on vacation…
 - Two families: pursue recreation…
- Hb.6:11-12
 - -Each (individual concern). My duty...
 - -Show (demonstrate, as v.10)
 - -Diligence (haste, opposite of sluggish, 12)
 - -Until the end (steadfast endurance)
 - -Imitate (6:4-6. Here, the best examples...)

Lord requires Christians to influence others for good –

- 1. Mt.5:13, we are *salt*...
 - Salt preserves / prevents decay
 - Salt flavors / seasons food. Mk.9:49.

 - Salt is an emblem of wisdom. Col.4:5-6.
 Ro.12:1. Phil.2
- 2. Mt.5:14-16, we are light... 1 Pt.2:11-12

Backwards progress

- 1. Did not learn from earlier golden calf, Ex.32
- 2. 1 K.12:28, 32 . . . 2 K.10:29, prolonged; apostasy grew worse
- 3. 2 K.17:16-18, gone!
- 4. Costly. 1 K.14:1
 - Jeroboam had it all...didn't need God...
 - Now, son is dying
 - He does not consult false priests...
 - Knew prophet could see future...

Abijah, the son of Jeroboam (1 K.14)

- 1. Something good in the child, 14:13
- 2. Child died, 14:17
 - Death spared Abijah from father's evil influence – mercy in disguise
 - But son's death removed salt and light from house of Jeroboam
