Greatest issue in life: how to win over sin?

1 Pt.2:11-12, a new beginning

Beloved: 8 times in 1-2 Peter

- -2 Pt.1:17, Christ
- -2 Pt.3:15, Paul
- -2 Pt.3:17, Christians
- 1 Pt.2:9-10: admonition is a sign of love
 - Love warns against danger (2 Pt.3:10-12)
 - Be grateful, not offended

Sojourners

Alien; one without rights of citizenship, 1:17 Gen.23:4

Pilgrims

Exile; sojourning in strange place, away from one's own people; suggests a visitor on a brief stay

Christians are on a journey (1 Pt.1:1; Ph.3:20)

We get constant reminders of our temporary visit on this planet

- 1. Hatred, 4:3-4. U.S. has changed
- 2. Persecution, 4:12-19. Rejoice (13)?
- 3. Death, 2 Pt.1:12-15 . . .
 - a. Hb.11:13, confessed... Abraham
 - b. Hb.11:14, seeking... (10). Gal.4:26
 - c. Hb.11:15, goal: looking ahead, not behind
 - d. Hb.11:16, desire: city of God

Abstain - hold self away from

- 1 Pt.2:11... a break with the past
- 1 Co.9:25
 - Self-controlled…
 - Do not Touch –

Fleshly lusts – strong desires

- 2 Pt.1:4; 2:18f.
 - Some Christians advertise fleshly lusts in their speech / dress / actions
 - -Sinners may know nothing about NT teaching, but they know a bad temper, selfishness, arrogance, dishonesty, and immodesty ... and judge us by these things
 - From infancy we try to satisfy desires; we must learn self-control

- Honorable (2x): lovely, attractive, winsome
- Observe implies close attention
 - a. Sinners watch Christians to find fault
 - b. Best answer for slander: a pure life

Day of visitation

- Visiting, inspection, either for
 - Judgment (Lk.19:44) ... or ...
 - Mercy (Gn.50:24)

Peter mentions "sin" three times

- 1. 1 Pt.2:21-22, Jesus committed <u>no sin</u>
- 2. 1 Pt.4:1, sufferers ceased from sin
- 3. 2 Pt.2:14, rebels cannot cease from sin

What to do?

- 1. Arm yourself with mind of Christ, 4:1
- 2. Adultery / covetousness begin in heart,2 Pt.2:14 guard the heart
- 3. Physically: you are what you eat. Spiritually: you are what you think.
