- Ps.41<sup>9</sup> ...my close friend in whom I trusted, who ate my bread, has lifted his heel against me.
- "Et tu, Brute?"

# Spiritual

- Moral failures
  - Disappointed with self (satan won). Mt.26
  - Church failures. 1 Co.5:1
    - (1) A 'Christian' worse than pagans
    - (2) A church that ignores it

## Become cynical

- Def.: question sincerity and goodness of people's motives and actions, or the value of living; opposite of optimism
- Cynic blames others for his own faults

  - 2. Jesus, Mt.26
  - 3. Churches, Ac.5-6
  - 4. Paul, 2 Tim.4:16
- Cynicism never solved a problem. Jn.20

  - Peter compares present suffering with future rejoicing
    - Various / manifold: many colored; various kinds
    - Genuineness of your faith: result of a test, genuine

Realize the testing of our faith is for our spiritual good Can a Christian rejoice in heaviness? 1. We receive grace and peace multiplied, 1:2 2. We have mercy that begets us to living hope, 1:3 3. We share an inheritance reserved in heaven, 1:4

Hope for the future gives consolation for the present

Gold is perishable, but faith waits for eternal inheritance
